German Congress on Crime Prevention



The German Congress on Crime Prevention was founded in 1995 as an annual national convention for the field of crime prevention.

The aim of the German Congress on Crime Prevention is to present and strengthen crime prevention within a broad societal framework. Thus it contributes to crime reduction as well as reducing both the fear of crime, and the number of victims of crime.

As an annually organized congress, the main objectives of the Congress are:

- ④ Presenting and exchanging current and basic questions of crime prevention and its effectiveness
- ④ Bringing together partners within the field of crime prevention
- ④ Functioning as a forum for the practice of crime prevention and for fostering the exchange of expertise
- ④ Helping to get into contact at the international level and to exchange information
- ④ Discussing implementation strategies
- ④ Developing and disseminating recommendations for practice, politics, administration and research in the field of crime prevention

Organisation [Bearbeiten]

Das Internationale Zentrum für Kriminalprävention wurde 1994 auf Initiative des französischen Bürgermeisters Gilbert Bonnemaison, dem Gründungspräsidenten des Europäischen Forum für Urbane Sicherheit gegründet. Mitglieder des ICPC sind sowohl Staaten wie auch Nichtregierungsorganisationen. Aus der Bundesrepublik Deutschland ist der Deutsche Präventionstag Mitglied des Zentrums.

Aufgaben [Bearbeiten]

Gründung und Entwicklung des Zentrums erfolgten in enger Partnerschaft mit den UN-Organisationen UN-HABITAT und UNODC, die zugleich auch Mitglied von ICPC sind. Zentraler Bestandteil der Aktivitäten von ICPC ist die Unterstützung des Wissens- und Erfahrungsaustausches in der internationalen Kriminalprävention. Hierzu veröffentlicht ICPC unter anderem alle zwei Jahre einen internationalen Bericht zu aktuellen Trends und Entwicklungen in der Kriminalprävention.



Beccaria Programms since 2003

The CRIME PREVENTION COUNCIL OF LOWER SAXONY (CPC) was founded in 1995 with the objective of reducing crime and improving the population's feeling of safety and security (www.lpr.niedersachsen.de).

The BECCARIA Programme is part of the CPC's activities. So far, there have been three consecutive projects, which were implemented within the framework of the European Union's AGIS- and ISEC-Programmes together with ten European partner organizations:

1. Quality management in crime prevention (2003-2005)
2. Qualification in crime prevention (2005-2007)
3. Knowledge transfer in crime prevention (2008-2011).

The BECCARIA Standards for ensuring quality in crime prevention projects have been translated so far into 16 languages (www.beccaria-standards.net).

The CPC's BECCARIA qualification programme has been offered annually since 2008 (www.beccaria.de) and has been presented *inter alia* at the XIth United Nations Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice in Brazil in April 2010. Apart from this in-service training, the first Master's programme in crime prevention at a German university will start in fall 2011. It has also been developed in the context of the BECCARIA-Programme (www.master-kriminalpraevention.de).

The objective of the English-speaking BECCARIA Internet-Portal is to facilitate the access to globally available knowledge on crime prevention (www.beccariaportal.org).

Moving knowledge into action

4th BECCARIA PROJECT 2012 to 2014

Strategies for bridging the gap between criminological research and prevention practice

Knowledge in criminology and crime prevention is often comparable to a „Black Hole“: Issues and data from the field are taken in, but nothing is coming back. It is primarily theoretical knowledge and rarely application oriented. Theoretical knowledge and knowledge from everyday practice are barely connected. All too often, criminological knowledge stops at recommendations for further action, without being processed for practitioners with a view to solutions or action.

Therefore, scientific results rarely obtain relevance for practical work. Therefore, the objectives of the fourth Beccaria project are: To address criminological knowledge and its perspectives for application more directly to decision-makers and practitioners, to close the gap between „knowledge-producers“ and „knowledge-users“, to create new opportunities for a low threshold, internet-based professional exchange and to increase professionalization in crime prevention by offering short-term advanced training (Summer Academy) and academic education at the Master's level.

The project's results are disseminated via the English-speaking Beccaria Portal. This Internet-Portal forms the core of the project and is to become a central interface of European crime prevention. Its wider acceptance is sought by the involvement of several national, European and international networks and partner organizations.

A new meta-portal crime prevention

The Beccaria Portal aims at the transfer of knowledge in crime prevention in Europe and the world.
