Crime Prevention Council of Lower Saxony

- In Germany, crime prevention is the **responsibility of all three levels** of government (Federal, State and Municipal).
- Due to the constitutional principle of **subsidiarity**, the role of nongovernmental organizations and local communities has precedence over activities at the state- or federal level.
- To coordinate these efforts, **crime prevention councils** have been established in many municipalities and most states.
- State crime prevention councils support and advise local crime prevention bodies and networks, disseminate scientific findings and practical experience concerning crime prevention, analyze crime trends and advise the government on issues of crime policy and interdepartmental cooperation in this field.
- The Crime Prevention Council of Lower Saxony presently has some 250 member organizations, its secretariat is part of the Department of Justice.





Some crime prevention-key problems of the first decade of the 21. Century

- 1. existing tools, standards and guidelines are not sufficiently used
- 2. multidisciplinary cooperation is still underdeveloped (in practice and science)
- 3. the global prevention knowledge is less converted
- 4. new types of crime and risks are perceived to late
- 5. knowledge exchange, discourses and benchmarking are not sufficiently widespread

existing tools, standards and guidelines are not sufficiently used

Multidisciplinary cooperation is still underdeveloped (in practice and science)

- a. crime prevention is not enough embedded in a multidisciplinary prevention network
- b. crime prevention research is not enough embedded in a multidisciplinary (new) "prevention science"
- c. We know it, but Franz von Liszt (1905): "a good social policy is the best criminal policy"

The global prevention knowledge is less converted

- a. We are still not very successfully, moving knowledge into action
- b. A kind of "Morbus punitivum" is a common disease
- c. it's an exhausting way to change from "more of the same" and "the fight against crime" to crime prevention as an individual and societal attitude

New types of crime and risks are perceived to late

The focus of crime-prevention activities continues to be on the areas of mass, violent and youth crime; however, other areas such as economic crime are increasing in significance.

And we must also not lose sight of the fact that our current global and core problems, which are all situations calling for prevention – in addition to war and terrorism, these include climate change, world nutrition, energy supply, and globalised financial transactions – have consequences that will substantially influence new developments in crime prevention. In the economic world we know a lot about Business Continuity Management, but we are still not good enough in Societal Continuity Management.

Knowledge exchange, discourses and benchmarking are not sufficiently widespread

- a. Concepts at local, regional, national and global levels are poorly networked
- b. if we only knew what we know about crime prevention
- c. Concepts, project reports and evaluations must be consistent on the Internet published and discussed
- d. Besides the very important structures supranational institutions like the UN and key research institutions as well as NGOs, there is almost no additional wiki orientation

GNSC may help to ...

- improve the exchange of information and know how between international institutions and their members;
- identify and initiate inter-organizational projects;
- organize inter-organizational peer dialogues, discourses and benchmarks;
- develop a better international documentation of project-quality-management and evidence based strategies;
- prepare and to support B to B Cooperations and twinning projects, e.g. between cities.
