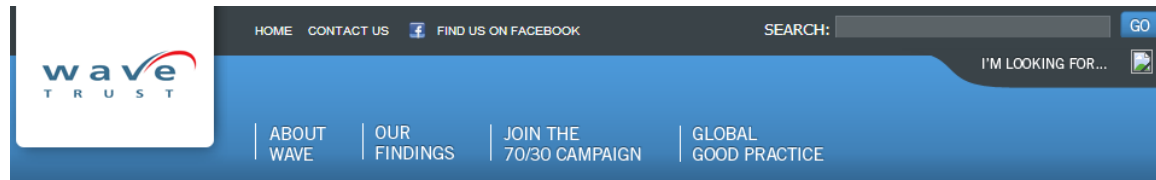

Prevention scientists are discovering that results often fall far short of expectations. For some programs, it's because they were not tested. For others, it's ineffective implementation. In collaboration with Dr. Richard Spoth and his colleagues at Iowa State University, the Center has developed the PROSPER Project. PROSPER stands for PROMoting School-community-university Partnerships to Enhance Resilience. The goal of PROSPER is to utilize the combined efforts of prevention scientists, the Cooperative Extension system, and local schools and community leaders to develop community partnerships that strengthen families and help young people avoid substance abuse and behavioral problems. The first five-years of the PROSPER project involves about 10,000 youth in 28 communities throughout Pennsylvania and Iowa. Penn State's portion of PROSPER includes an award of \$9.9 million from the National Institute on Drug Abuse.

What is restorative justice?

Restorative justice is a theory of justice that emphasizes repairing the harm caused or revealed by criminal behaviour. It is best accomplished through cooperative processes that include all stakeholders.

Practices and programs reflecting restorative purposes will respond to crime by:

1. identifying and taking steps to repair harm,
2. involving all stakeholders, and
3. transforming the traditional relationship between communities and their governments in responding to crime.
