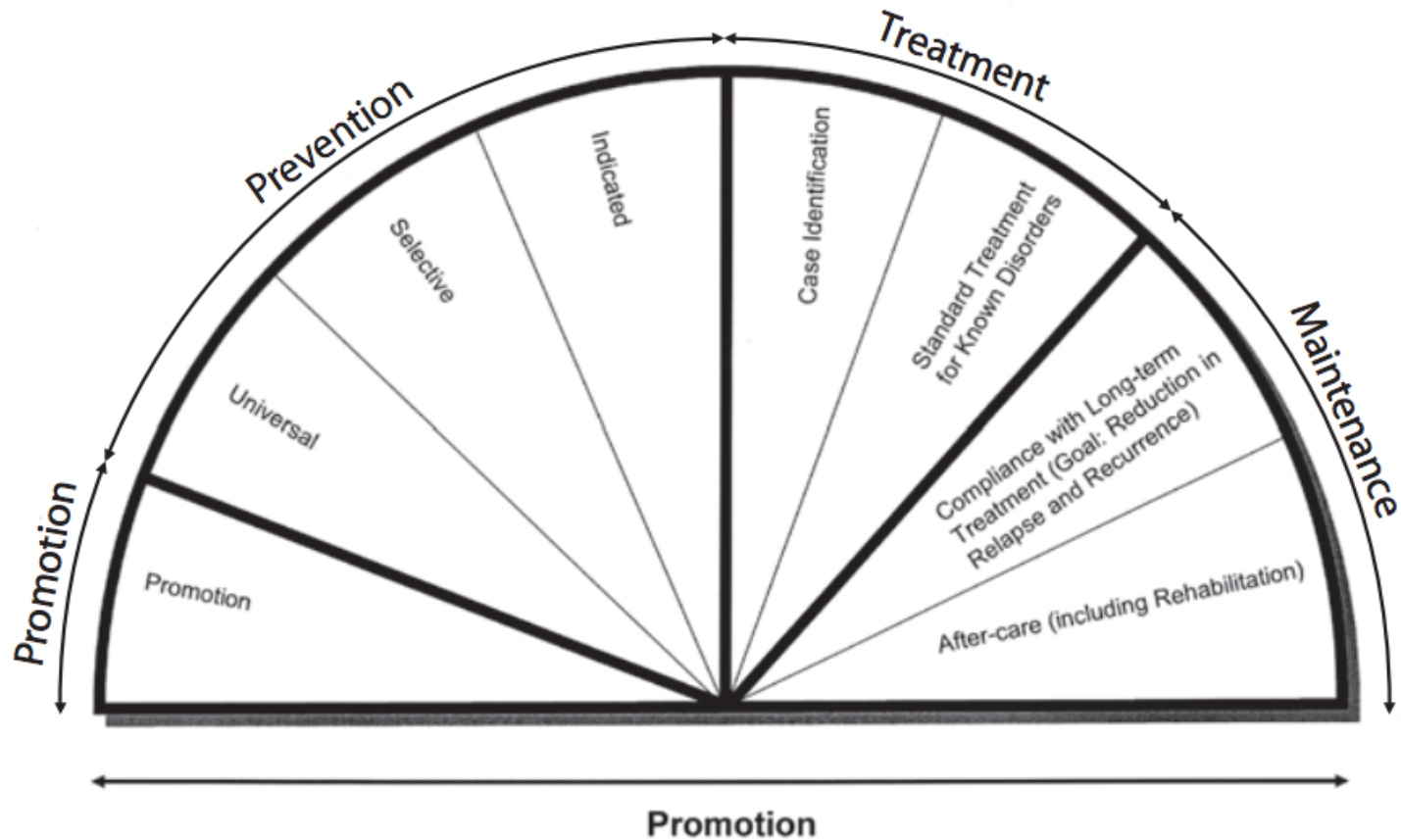

# W H O – Guide 2004

1. Create, implement and monitor a national action plan for violence prevention.
2. Enhance capacity for collecting data on violence.
3. Define priorities for, and support research on, the causes, consequences, costs and prevention of violence.
4. Promote primary prevention responses.
5. Strengthen responses for victims of violence.

# W H O – Guide 2004

6. Integrate violence prevention into social and educational policies, and thereby promote gender and social equality.
7. Increase collaboration and exchange of information on violence prevention.
8. Promote and monitor adherence to international treaties, laws and other mechanisms to protect human rights.
9. Seek practical, internationally agreed responses to the global drugs and global arms trade.

#### **Preface**

Quality criteria for planning, implementing and evaluating crime-prevention projects have hardly existed up to now. The professional exchange on this complex of topics is also still at the very beginning nationally as well as throughout Europe.

Standards as a yardstick for checking project scheduling and implementation are an initial step on the way to checking the effectiveness of crime-prevention projects and to an increased quality orientation.

The present Beccaria standards have been developed in the framework of the “Beccaria Project: Quality Management in Crime Prevention”. This project was supported by the AGIS programme of the European Commission.

The Beccaria standards are intended as a recommendation for an increased quality orientation in prevention work. They are an initial outline for discussion and should be consistently improved and

### Prison, Police, and Programs: Evidence-Based Options that Reduce Crime and Save Money

Since the 1990s, the Washington State legislature has directed the Washington State Institute for Public Policy to identify policies with an “evidence-based” track record of improving certain public policy outcomes. Outcomes of interest have included, among others, education, child welfare, crime, and mental health.

This report updates and extends WSIPP’s list of well-researched policies that reduce crime. We display our current tabulation of evidence-based prevention, juvenile justice, and adult corrections programs, and we include our initial reviews of prison sentencing and policing.

As with our previous lists, we find that a number of public policies can reduce crime and are likely to have benefits that exceed costs. We also find credible evidence that some policies do not reduce crime and are likely to have costs that exceed benefits. The legislature has previously used this type of information to craft policy and budget bills. This updated list is designed to help with subsequent budgets and policy legislation.

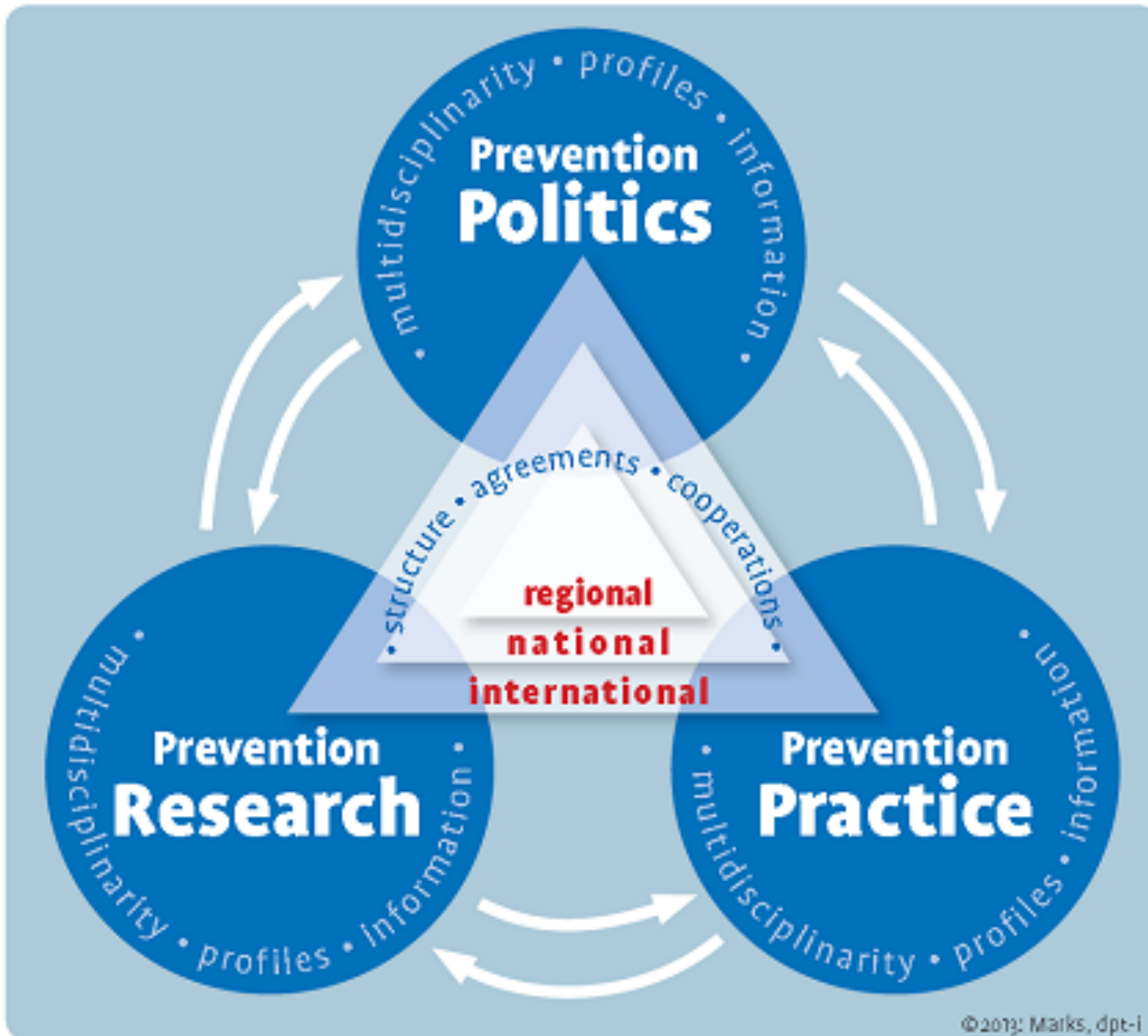

# Austrian Crime Policy Network: The Ten Golden Rules of Crime Policy

1. **Good crime policy is rational crime policy** that safeguards people and legally protected interests and promotes concurrence with measured and differentiated reactions.
2. **Basic rights and human rights** provide the yardstick and the parameters of criminal law.
3. The best crime policy is **embedded in good social and economic policies.**
4. **Crime policy is exclusively concerned with the core area of social standards.** The scaling of penal sanctions and their use as a response in individual cases shall be measured and proportionate.
5. Crime policy must respect and safeguard the **independent nature of jurisdiction.**

# Austrian Crime Policy Network: The Ten Golden Rules of Crime Policy

- Appropriate penal reactions must consider special needs, especially those of young and mentally ill delinquents, and factor in all **consequences and impacts of sanctions on criminal behaviour.**
- **Crime policy reaches out to the victims of criminal offences** and acknowledges that they are the party most affected by the crime.
- It is the aim of good policing **to facilitate the peaceful and emancipated coexistence of people, population groups and organisations** within the framework of the rule of law.
- A reaction to crimes that **promotes reintegration into society** should already be considered or initiated at the stage of the criminal proceedings.
- **The prison regime is a gauge of society's maturity in the field of human rights.**

## German Congress on Crime Prevention

The German Congress on Crime Prevention – GCOCP (in German: Deutscher Präventionstag – DPT) is on the one hand the 1995 founded and meanwhile world's largest annual conference on the topic of crime prevention and related prevention areas. On the other hand the GCOCP forms with its **Institute for Applied Prevention Research (DPT-I)** and other key activities a platform for information, knowledge transfer and an interdisciplinary dialogue between prevention practice, prevention research and prevention policies.

Since 2007 the German Congress on Crime Prevention (GCOCP) is hosting the Annual International Forum (AIF) to address the international (non-German speaking) audience. The aim of the AIF is to add a international perspective to the German Congress and to give the opportunity to share experiences in crime prevention on an international level. While the world is growing closer research as well as experience should be disseminated within a broad professional framework. Therefore we ask international experts from all areas of crime prevention to introduce, share and discuss their ideas, goals, outcomes, projects and speeches with other experts and to experience the German modality of crime prevention.

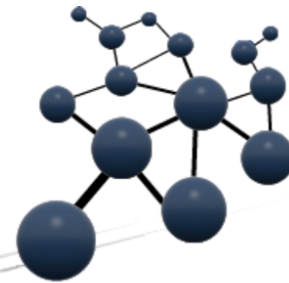
